


Kærlund 1600 sows, Give, Jutland







Our focus in the herd is



Drying before sows are placed in farrowing pens



Increase number of weaned per weaning

0.5 piglet per weaning = 10 farrowing pens




Surveillance at night

Reduce stillborn, more focus on sows and piglets small at birth



Does the weekday of weaning matter?

Saturday weanings led to 2.1% drop in mortality





Danvet Golden Standard herds

10 herds with low mortality What do they do?

Same staff weekdays and weekends 90%

3-4 feedings per day of lactating sows
100%

Litter equalization before lunch 100%

Procedures to ensure a high level of hygiene

Two or three step nurse sows 100%








Who is in our team at Kærlund?





Follow up even after years of employment



Pay attention to employees


